POLICY ON ART EXHIBITS AT THE LIBRARY

Effective Date: January 17, 2018

POLICY OVERVIEW/DESCRIPTION

The Kellogg-Hubbard Library provides art exhibit spaces for local artists to display their work; The art displayed must be deemed suitable for a public library display area open to adults and children of all ages. Exhibit spaces are available to artists on equal terms, regardless of opinion or affiliation; the Library neither sponsors nor endorses the views of any group or individual using the exhibit and display spaces. Art exhibits cannot interfere with patron use of the Library or general operations.

The Board of Trustees authorizes the Co-Directors to establish and implement expectations and procedures for all pertinent aspects of use of exhibit space. The Co-Directors determine which spaces are made available for exhibits, the suitability of art for exhibition, and all other aspects of implementing the expectations and procedures developed to carry out this policy. In the event that a potential exhibitor is not satisfied with the Co-Directors' decision on the suitability of art for exhibition, an appeal can be made to the Board's Executive Committee.
